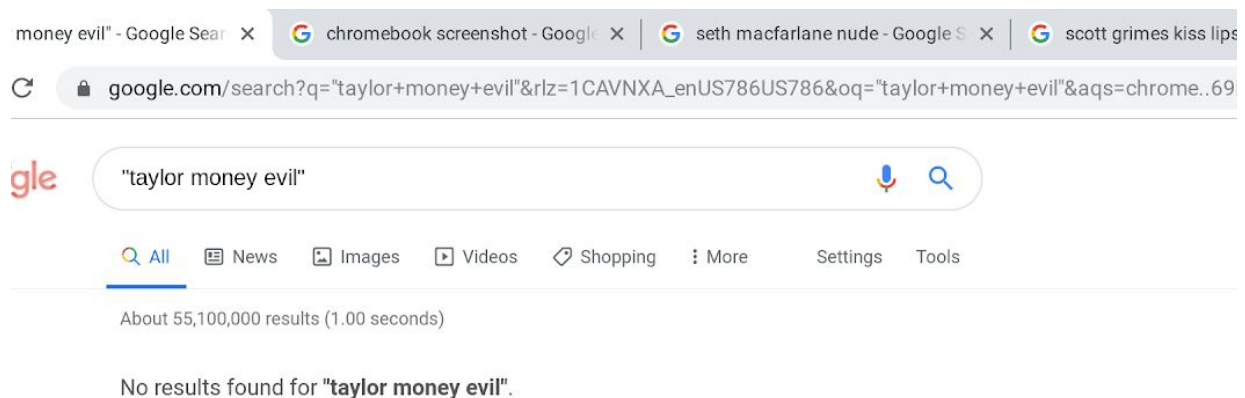


# And Rage Against Machines?
